I could not be more excited to share the 2021 Yolo County Children's Alliance annual report with you. What an exciting, inspiring, and transformative year it has been for the organization! I not only took on the mantle of leadership as the Executive Director, I've continued to guide the organization through the pandemic as we collectively work together to create a more equitable community for all. Like most people-facing organizations, the pandemic continues to challenge every aspect of our work both internally and externally, however we've managed to persevere and rise to the occasion time and time again. Our dedicated staff have done an incredible job at expanding our outreach while strengthening programs and services. I am so proud of what we achieved last year—and we have so much left to do as we work together to support families and children in Yolo County.

Last year, our community and individual impact resounded throughout the organization with an increase in program participation, from our nationally accredited Home Visiting Program to the Housing/Homeless Prevention Programs, as well as the various programs of the Family Resource Center.

YCCA provided 4,339 unduplicated individuals with Family Resource Center services, permanently housed over 100 homeless individuals through Project Roomkey and Homekey, 145 families received home visiting services. Through our community events, nearly 4097 children were provided with new backpacks and school supplies, winter coats and blankets, and holiday toys amongst food and other essential resources.

Thank you for making 2021 another remarkable year for the Yolo County Children's Alliance! Your support of our mission has meant the world to our team and the communities we serve.

We are looking forward to much more in 2022!

Supporting Families through HOUSING

Since 2011, the Yolo County Children's Alliance has focused our housing initiatives on preventing homelessness, and addressing housing insecurity in our community. From 2017–2019, the City of West Sacramento determined a 43% increase in homelessness. Of those counted, nearly 40% of those individuals had children.

When the pandemic hit in 2020, our Homelessness Prevention Team saw a rapid increase in need for housing support. The State's Housing is Key program provided an opportunity for families to avoid eviction by providing rent and utility support to those who qualify.

Our housing team supported nearly 20-clients weekly, and have helped bring more than \$200,000 to families at-risk of eviction.



Project Homekey and Project Roomkey were started as an aid for the homeless to prevent the spread of COVID-19, and now, the programs' focus has evolved to include helping our clients obtain permanent housing and prepare them to live independently. Many of our clients have no access to basic identification documents, which is where the YCCA staff assist in helping clients obtain these documents, and provide assistance with housing applications and overall support. Our five onsite staff provide these services to an average of 100 clients at one time throughout the program. On top of clerical work, something often forgotten is that many of the people our staff help are used to living on the streets; transitioning into a safe space that is your own is a significant, and oftentimes difficult, adjustment in someone's life.

At Project Homekey, our staff and our partners, Mercy Coalition and the City of West Sacramento Police Department, approach their work with a trauma-informed lens. Often, the clients our team are supporting have experienced extreme trauma. Our staff's time, effort, patience, and overall willingness to work in a challenging environment has proven positive outcomes for clients, and the Homekey Program.

Our staff helped provide permanent housing to more than 100 individuals in 2021.

The work our team does can be hard, frustrating and emotionally taxing at times. But the ability to provide someone with not only permanent housing, but the skills and courage to live on their own, is a priceless outcome of the Project Homekey and Roomkey programs.
