Yolo County Children's Alliance exists to protect and empower children by strengthening families throughout Yolo County. We do this by ensuring everyone has access to the resources they need to build meaningful ties to their communities and each other.



FAMILY SUPPORT

Ensuring families of all kinds have access to the resources they need to build meaningful ties to their communities and each other.

16,600

Households received weekly groceries through YCCA's Friday food distributions. In partnership with the Yolo Food Bank, YCCA was able to support 40,000 family members every Friday morning in 2022 at our West Sacramento Family Resource Center. **425** households received enrollment support for CalFresh, California's supplemental nutrition program.

1,624

Families received concrete resources directly out of YCCA's Family Resource Center including: emergency housing assistance, transportation assistance, homeless shelter referrals and housing support, emergency food bags, emergency diaper bags, childcare support, hygiene kits, disaster relief supplies, general referrals, and more.

295

Families received application and enrollment support for health coverage through YCCA's Community Health Initiative. Through our CHI program, families and individuals can enroll with MediCal and Covered California. Additionally, YCCA brought no-cost Flu and COVID-19 vaccines to underserved communities ensuring equitable access to health resources.

120+

Individuals received support through our Siemer Family Stability Program. This program provides long-term case management for families with school-age children who are at risk of homelessness or are experiencing homelessness; the goal of this program is to bring support to families and prevent family-homelessness.



PARENT EDUCATION

Supporting and coaching parents and children to help them succeed and thrive.

269

Children received free behavioral health developmental screenings for children ages 0-5 through YCCA's Help Me Grow Yolo County program. These screenings included referral and assistance for follow up treatment if needed.

135

Families were supported through YCCA's Healthy Families Yolo County home visiting program. This nationally accredited program is essential for parent support, coaching, and the child's wellbeing.

102

Children graduated from YCCA's parent-child interactive workshops through the Early Childhood Education program. These workshops develop school readiness and increase the skills and confidence of parents to become their child's first teacher.

44

Parents and caregivers participated in YCCA's English, Spanish, and Dari-led Nurturing Parenting Courses. Through NPP, parents and caregivers learn how to develop their parenting skills, promote a healthy physical and emotional environment, and foster self-awareness and nurturing for the parent.



COMMUNITY COLLABORATION

Gathering and disseminating local input about the needs and well-being of Yolo County families.

Individuals received free tax preparation assistance through YCCA's Voluntary Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. YCCA's VITA program is held in partnership with United Way. YCCA staff assisted in bringing \$1,228,715 back into our local economy through refunds in 2022.

255

Individuals received various forms of support through YCCA's Project Homekey and Roomkey. These two programs provide housing and concrete resources to individuals experiencing homelessness in the City of West Sacramento, and Yolo County. These programs are possible because of our partnership with the City of West Sacramento, their Police Department, Mercy Coalition, and Yolo County Health and Human Services. Through YCCA's Housing Program, **25** individuals were permanently housed; **150** unique walk-up clients were helped and provided more than **10,048** emergency food bags and more than **3,920** hygiene bags & articles of clothing. Additionally, two homeless resource fairs were held with an average attendance of **150** individuals experiencing homelessness.
