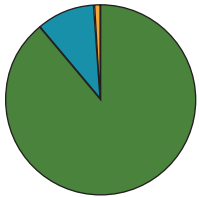

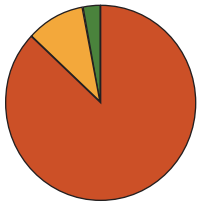

HOW WE HELP



INCREASED FAMILY STABILITY

Through our housing stability services, we address needs such as eviction prevention, financial aid for move-in expenses, enrollment in utility assistance programs, and support for homeless individuals and families. In 2023, our team secured permanent housing for 55 families, arranged temporary housing for 109 families, delivered crucial housing support to 133 individuals via Project Homekey, and safeguarded the stability of 114 families by preventing evictions.



INCREASED PROTECTIVE FACTORS

Our home visiting programs and child developmental screenings ensure every child receives the support they need from the start. In 2023, 131 families received home visiting services through the Healthy Families Yolo County™ program. 242 families received subsidized childcare through the CalWorks Childcare Subsidy program.

ECONOMIC SELF-SUFFICIENCY

We take pride in providing free tax assistance through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program. In 2023, we assisted 630 households with free tax preparation services, resulting in a total of \$830,653 in refunds, putting money back into the pockets of hard-working individuals and families.

ACCESS TO FOOD

Each week an average of 350 households receive groceries through our food distribution in partnership with Yolo Food Bank. In 2023, our team enrolled 84 individuals in CalFresh food aid.



ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE

As part of our region’s Community Health Initiative, YCCA’s certified enrollment counselors enrolled 205 individuals in health coverage through Medi-Cal and Covered California in 2023.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

YCCA’s Family Resource Center is the central hub for resources and referrals, linking families to essential services like financial assistance, parenting classes, health insurance enrollment, and more. Our multilingual staff ensures access to fundamental resources for stability.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Our workforce development program at The Center on West Cap empowers at-risk teens and young adults aged 17-24, including those in foster care, experiencing homelessness, or involved in the justice system. In 2023, 13 young adults benefited from this program.
