

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT FY 2023-24




Revenue



Resource and Referral Services

Basic Needs

Meeting basic needs is foundational to preventing child abuse and promoting health equity. YCCA's Resource & Referral programs offer direct support to reduce household stress, strengthen protective factors, and ensure families have access to essential services. We help families overcome immediate barriers by providing diapers, hygiene kits, gas cards, and more—so they can focus on long-term goals in a safe, stable environment.

Total Services: 1,484 | Unduplicated Clients: 786

Free Tax Preparation Services (VITA)

Our multilingual VITA program promotes financial stability and economic inclusion by helping families access the refunds and credits they've earned. By removing barriers like cost, complexity, and language, this service puts money back into the hands of those who need it most—fueling household prosperity and long-term well-being.

847 households served

Immigration & Refugee Services

Culturally and linguistically responsive support for refugee and immigrant families—including case management, housing, education, and legal navigation.

Emergency Food Support

Workforce Development

Through WIOA and youth-focused employment support, we close opportunity gaps for young people facing systemic barriers—helping them build brighter futures through job readiness, financial literacy, and mentoring. 27 individuals served

Our team helps hundreds of families navigate social safety net programs, prevent utility shutoffs, and access life-sustaining resources—ensuring no one falls through the cracks.



April: Child Abuse Prevention Month

Each April, the Yolo County Children's Alliance (YCCA) takes center stage as the Child Abuse Prevention Council (CAPC), leading our community in a powerful month of advocacy. In 2024, our "Be The One" campaign emphasized the critical need to protect children and invited everyone to be the one who makes a difference in a child's life.



Why It Matters: This annual observance serves as both a celebration of our achievements and a vital call to action—raising awareness, building family resilience, and creating safe environments where all children can thrive.



Our Impact:

- **Community Activation:** Successfully coordinated 30 pinwheel garden installations across the county, visual reminders of our collective commitment to childhood innocence
- **Strategic Outreach:** Reached 28,881 community members through engaging events, targeted news coverage, and compelling social media campaigns.
- **Inclusive Engagement:** Connected with our diverse Yolo County population through bilingual media appearances and multilingual materials, ensuring no community was left behind

The Result: A measurable increase in community awareness about prevention strategies and a surge in local participation, which strengthened our county-wide safety net for children.

Community Health Initiative



Health care and nutrition access are essential to child safety and family resilience. Our Community Health Initiative advances health equity by ensuring families can access care without barriers.

YCCA's Community Health Initiative reflects our deep commitment to reducing disparities and promoting wellness across Yolo County. Health coverage and food access are not only basic needs—they are protective factors that reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect by decreasing family stress, improving caregiver capacity, and supporting the overall well-being of children. This initiative is part of YCCA's broader strategy to create equitable, trauma-informed systems of care that uplift families and prevent crises before they begin.

Rooted in YCCA's role as a trusted connector and advocate for prevention, this initiative provides culturally responsive, multilingual support to help families enroll in and maintain life-sustaining programs like Medi-Cal, CalFresh, and Covered California.

• Medi-Cal Enrollment Support

We help families enroll and stay enrolled in Medi-Cal, connecting them to primary care, behavioral health, and preventive services that support healthy child development.

Our Healthy Families Yolo County™ home visitation program creates strong foundations by supporting caregivers and children from pregnancy through age 3. Our specialists provide practical guidance on pregnancy self-care, soothing techniques, and nutrition while connecting families to vital community resources. As part of Healthy Families America®, the signature program of Prevent Child Abuse America®, we're backed by the nation's oldest and largest child abuse prevention organization.

Through early intervention and consistent support, we strengthen families and build protective factors that ensure children thrive.

"After having my baby, I was really struggling but didn't know it was postpartum depression. My home visitor saw the signs and got me help without ever making me feel judged. I trusted her because she'd been there for me since pregnancy. The resources she connected me to and her constant support changed everything - I honestly don't know where we'd be without this program."
